PLAN TO TAX PERSONAL SERVICE CORPORATIONS

(By United Press.)
WASHINGTON, May 21.—As one method of making up loss due to the supreme court's decision against taxing stock dividends, the house ways and means committee today decided to report amendments to the war revenue act taxing personal service corporations the same as other corporations. By the amendment, it is expected that distribution of large undivided profits can be forced and taxes collected thereon. To block suits for reimbursements of taxes paid before the supreme court's decision, other amendments provide that taxes of 30 per cent for 1918 and 20 per cent for 1919 be assessed against personal service corporations if they start such suits.

CREDIT DEFLATION MAY BRING 20 PERCENT CUT

(By United Press.)
WASHINGTON, May 21.—Prices will be reduced at least 20 per cent if the federal reserve board is able to carry through its program of credit deflation, officials in touch with the nation's banking system predicted. As free distribution of commodities is resumed by the breaking of the freight congestion, the decline in prices may reach 10 per cent, according to government experts.

U. S. STRIVES TO WIN RELEASE OF CAPTIVES

(By Associated Press.)
WASHINGTON, May 21.—Aroused by reports of the imprisonment and detention in soviet Russia of various American citizens, the state department has taken steps to bring to bear indirect pressure on the bolshevik authorities to obtain their release. A request has been addressed to the Russian government through the American commissioner in Vienna, asking that Hungarian communists, detained since their escape to Vienna from Budapest last year, and whose release has been made the subject of overtures by the bolsheviks, shall be refused release pending the freeing of American citizens detained in Russia. Action by this government was taken, it was said as a result of a suggestion of another government and was in accord with the views of other countries. One of the Americans known to be imprisoned in Russia by the bolsheviks, Xenophon B. Kalaitiano, has been made the subject of ineffectual representations for more than a year. According to the latest reports received by the department, Kalaitiano is in close confinement and is being starved to death.

DANIELS ASSIGNS SHIP TO CARRY ATHLETES

NEW YORK, May 21.—Secretary of the Navy Daniels has assigned the U. S. S. Frederick, an armored cruiser, for the transportation and accommodation of the officers and men of the United States navy and the navy reserve forces who may qualify for participation in the Olympic games at Antwerp, Belgium, as members of the American Olympic team. This announcement was made last night by Commander C. H. Mayo, U. S. N., at a meeting of the executive committee of the American Olympic committee.

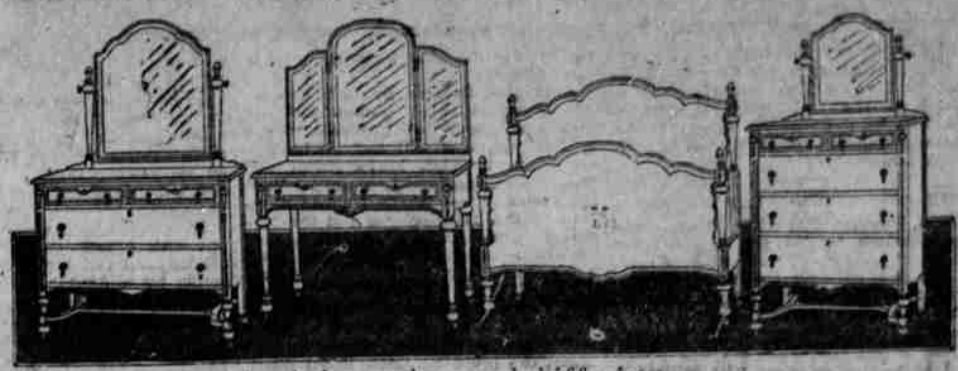
