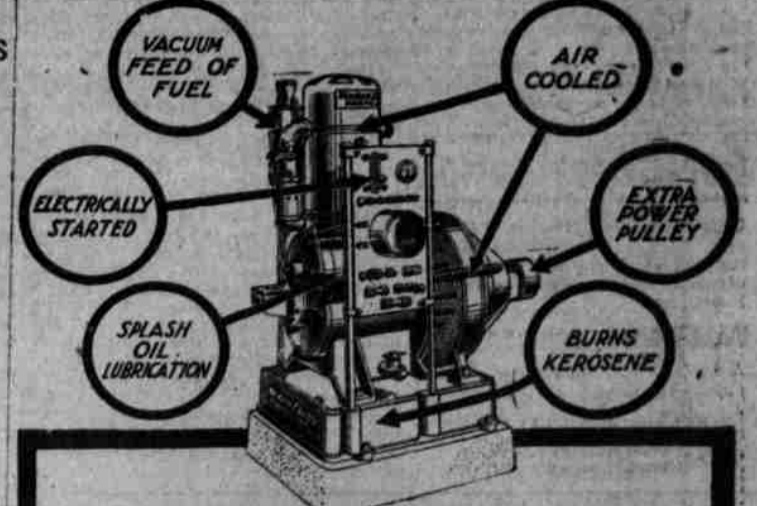
MIDDLEWEIGHT CHAMPION WHOSE DEFEAT OF MIKE O'DOWD SURPRISED THE BOXING FANS

NEW YORK, May 19.—When the news was flashed from the Boston ringside that Johnny Wilson had won the world's middleweight championship from Mike O'Dowd, of St. Paul, a few night's ago very few followers of pugilism could identify the new title holder.

Wilson, whose real name is Giovanni Panica, was born on East 106th Street, New York City, next door to the birthplace of Willa Jackson, the promising contender for lightweight honors on March 23, 1922.
