APPROPRIATIONS ARE GIVEN PREFERENCE

(By United Press.) WASHINGTON, May 22.—Senate Republicans in caucus today refused to take any action regarding bills to reduce the high cost of living, measures to regulate the meat packers, the soldiers' bonus and other important legislation. Consideration of these measures before any recess for political

conventions was urged by Kenyon and other senators. The caucus decided that appropriation bills and conference reports will be given preference in senate.

Own Forces Desert. (By United Press.) WASHINGTON, May 22.—Deserted by some of their own forces, insurgent republican senators were outmaneuvered in their fight to have congress stay in session until they had enacted legislation to lower the cost of living.

Following the caucus at which the republican senators decided to back the party leaders against the insurgents, Kenyon abandoned his plan to carry the fight for consideration of cost of living bills to the senate floor. He told the senate that senators informed him they did not want to be in the position of voting against consideration of the appropriation bills.

COLBY LETTER FAVORS RECOGNITION OF IRISH

WASHINGTON, May 22.—Secretary of State Colby wrote to Chairman Porter, of the house foreign affairs committee today that nothing connected with the foreign relations of the United States should deter the committee from any action it felt impelled to take on legislation proposing recognition of the Irish republic by the United States.

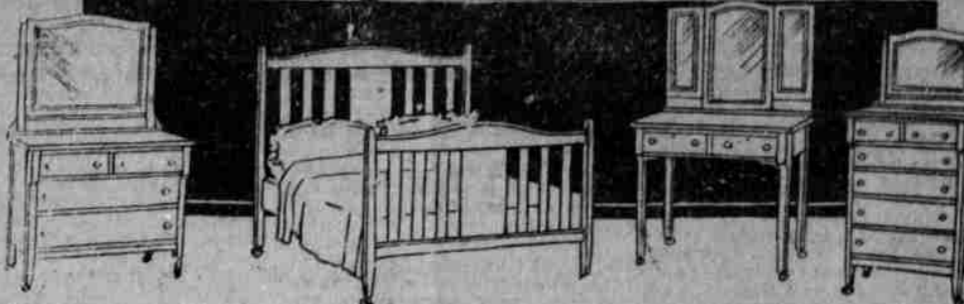

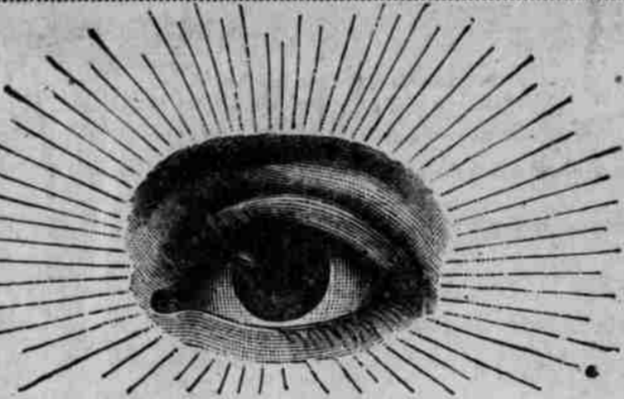
