School Districts May Lower Tax.
Now that the two mill tax for elementary schools has been passed by the voters of Oregon, school districts may prepare to lower their special district levies as much as \$350 per teacher, on the basis of 20 pupils to the teacher. The law, as it affects Umatilla county, makes the tax levy equivalent to \$650 per teacher in the various districts. Those which pay more than that amount by special tax can readjust their axes downward.
