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FIGHT TICKETS GO ON SALE FOR RINGSIDES; COUNTY IS PLACARDED

Legion Fight on July 3 Getting Under Way; Local Boy is Working Out and Other Principals Will Come Soon.

Tickets for ringside seats have gone on sale in Pendleton for the American Legion's big Saturday night, July 3. Members of the committee have been provided with supplies of the pastebords and the Charles Company and The Coey also have tickets on sale. The seats will be open to reservations on Saturday, June 26.

Milton, Freewater, Athena and Pendleton have been placarded with big red, white and blue posters announcing the card. A large number of fans from the three east end communities on Sunday promised to attend. They all agreed that the lineup of talent on the card is a winner.

Buddy Stevens, local boy who is to take part in the eight round preliminary with Johnny Plisk, is working out here constantly and is confident that he can do away with the Denver boy. A number of local fans will go to Walla Walla this evening to see the smoker put on by the legion there in which Plisk is one of the combatants.

Walla Walla will also hear of the local smoker tonight, as some of the boys going over will take handbills, advertising the local card. At the first fight held here in April, Walla Walla sent over quite a delegation to back their favorite, Gene Bartell, in his bout with Stevens.

Johnny Noye, one of the four headline artists in the fight here, is due to box before a Portland audience tomorrow night. From there he will return to Boise for a return engagement on Next Monday. He will come here direct from Boise and do some working out on the business end of a pitchfork on the Peringer ranch on the reservation.

The committee on training quarters is already getting busy to arrange for workouts for the eight boxers. They are expected to begin arriving here about a week before the fight and probably will work out each day in the local gym.

A carefully organized campaign to fill Happy Canyon for the fight is to

be made by the Legion committee shortly. The card is the most expensive ever undertaken in Eastern Oregon and the boys will have to have an audience larger than for the first bouts if they are to break even. The eight boys on the card, their transportation and expenses, advertising, referee, training quarters, etc., are expected to run in excess of \$4000.

EASTERN CREWS TUNE UP BOATS FOR RACES

ITHACA, N. Y., June 15.—Light practice with leisurely spins over the Cayuga lake course yesterday was the order of the day for the Cornell, Syracuse and Columbia varsity, junior varsity and freshmen crews in training for the intercollegiate regatta on Saturday.

Coach Ten Eyck of Syracuse with his squad of oarsmen, temporarily depleted by commencement exercises at Syracuse rigged up a "varsity" crew with subs and directed an easy routine. The heat of the morning also caused Coach Rice of Columbia to give his crews a light workout. This afternoon Coach Charles E. Courtney of Cornell paid his first visit to the Columbia crews at Glenwood and spent an hour visiting Coach Rice and his life long friend, Fred Plakstad, boat builder and an old time oarsman.

BENNY LEONARD WONT FIGHT IN ROSE CITY

LOS ANGELES, June 15.—Benny Leonard, lightweight champion, announced here today he had cancelled scheduled bouts with Johnny Seppard in Portland, Or., and "Dancing Jimmy" Duffy in San Francisco and would leave next week for Chicago to begin training for a 15-round match with Charley White at Benton Harbor, Mich., July 5.

Leonard said his physician advised him not to work out for two weeks because of a strained tendon in his left side.

SHAMROCK TO BE PUT IN WATER AGAIN TODAY

CITY ISLAND, N. Y., June 15.—Plans were completed last night to relaunch at high water today Shamrock IV, Sir Thomas Lipton's challenger for the America's cup. The green racer has been on the ways since Friday, having her underbody polished and groomed preparatory to her trial races with the 23 meter Shamrock.

The "trial horse" has been in the water since Friday and is rigged except her Marconi topmast but has not been tried out under all.

Plans call for the entire "Lipton navy" to leave here Wednesday morning for Sandy Hook. Sir Thomas will lead the fleet in his recently chartered steam yacht Victoria. The challenger and the trial horse will be towed by the tug Governor Smith, which has been painted green to correspond with the colors of the other Lipton craft. The houseboat Killarney also will be towed to the Hook and the other craft will go down under their own power.

HOLLAND BEATS SOUTH AFRICA IN NET PLAY

AMSTERDAM, June 15.—In the preliminaries for the Davis cup, Holland defeated South Africa. In the matches just concluded at Arnhem, Dutch representatives beat the South African players three matches to two. They thereby qualified for the final round for the Davis cup.

In the drawings Holland and South Africa were paired; France and the United States were paired and the British Isles and Canada each drew byes. The winner of the South Africa-Holland preliminaries was drawn to play Canada but as Canada has defaulted through lack of players Holland reaches the final round. The American team will meet the French

team at Eastbourne, England, July 9, 9 and 10. The winner of this play will meet the British team and the victor will contest against Holland.

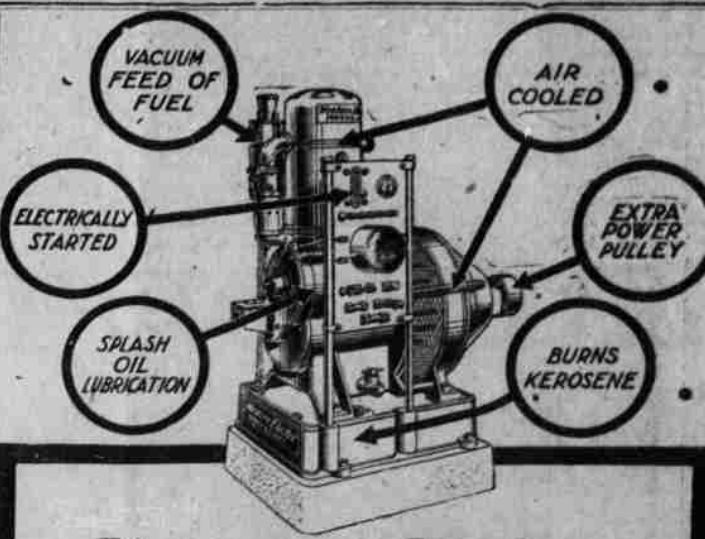
