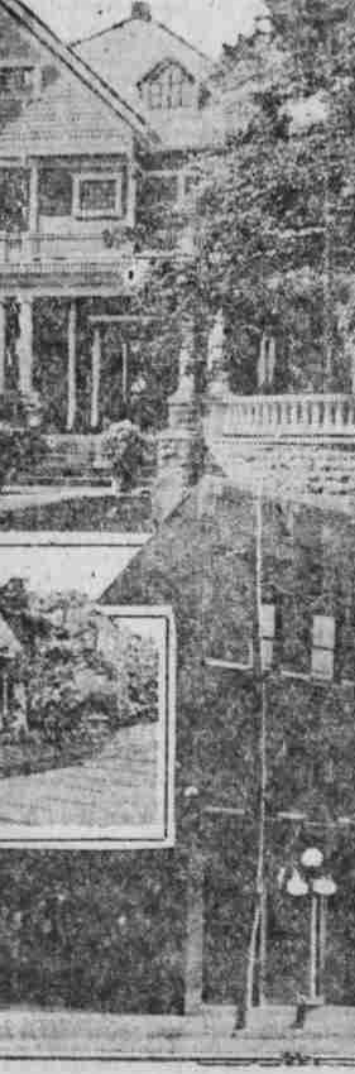
Six Are Dead and Unknown Number Injured When Flames Sweep Apartment House in Vancouver, B. C.
