### GENERAL WANGEL'S ARMY OBLITERATED

LONDON, June 29.—The army of General Wangel, the anti-bolshevik leader in Crimea, was completely destroyed, according to a Sebastopol dispatch. The thirteenth bolshevik army captured the entire left bank of the Dnieper river, it was stated. The Moscow official wireless said the new offensive of red troops against the Whites put the second Polish army entirely out of action and cut the third army off from all communication.

### WILD ANIMALS NOT TO PREVENT EDUCATION

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, June 29.—Cougars and bears and lonely mountains will not stand between Dorothy Dickey and a University education. This sophomore from Eugene will earn part of her way through the University next year by serving as first lookout on the top of Priest Point, a lonely station on the McKenzie watershed 51 miles from Eugene.

Miss Dickey's post is 15 miles from McKenzie bridge, the nearest post office. This distance can only be covered on foot or with a pack horse and the food and supplies for the young woman and her mother and sister who will accompany her must be packed in when they take up their watch July 1st.

Wild game of all sorts abounds in the district in which the young University woman will make her long vigil and she proudly exhibits a thoroughly efficient revolver with which she promises to receive any interlopers, be they human or beast, cordially and effectively.

Miss Dickey has supported herself during the past year through work in the University dining hall and equaled her lookout position memorably as part of the business of earning an education.

### THREE TIMES DRUNK IS PARAGUAY LIMIT

ASUNCION, June 23.—Persons arrested for drunkenness more than three times a year in Paraguay will be considered confirmed drunkards and their photographs posted in saloons and police stations under the provisions of a bill which has been approved by the senate and is now before the lower house.

The law would also forbid the sale of liquor in theaters, moving picture houses, race tracks and other places of public gathering and within two hundred meters of places where laborers work. The president is empowered to issue a decree determining the alcoholic content of intoxicating liquors and fixing other restrictions tending to make their consumption less injurious to the public health. Provision is also made for anti-alcoholic propaganda in the public schools.
