each of his novel, one or more characters to represent the finest achievements of Mr. King's view of life, the ability to sacrifice material comfort for the furtherance of an ideal is the end of all action, the point of view for which we should all strive.

This, at least, is the underlying theme that he has emphasized in "The Street Called Straight." In this story, Peter Davenant, the son of missionaries, himself a world traveler, rich and capable, has learned that wealth in itself has no meaning for him. He has the ability to earn fabulous wealth but finds no pleasure in merely spending money for his own personal comfort. His opinions on the subject were expressed figuratively when he said: "Money would be a doubtful blessing to the bee if it took away the task of gathering honey." And so Mr. King has made the keynote of Peter Davenant's character the search for idealism in action, for the chance of doing a gracious thing. In the course of the story, Peter is given the opportunity to practise the altruism which lies at the basis of his character. His readiness to give all that he has to save another affects the lives of all the members of two families. Just how it converts their conventional views of life and brings happiness out of a chaotic situation is developed in the course of the story. Incidentally, Peter himself finds a happiness which he long thought would be denied him.

ALLIES AND GERMANS REACH NEW DEADLOCK

S.P.A. July 14.—(A. P.)—A deadlock has been reached by the allies and Germans on the coal question and Marshall Foch and Field Marshall Wilson, allied military chiefs, have again been summoned to discuss possible enforcement measures.

Answer Postponed.
S.P.A. July 14.—(By A. P.)—Allied prime ministers have decided not to insist upon the Germans replying to the allied ultimatum regarding coal deliveries by 3 o'clock today. The Germans will be permitted to defer their reply until tomorrow. Experts on both sides are spending the day examining the situation.

ANYBODY NEED A ROYAL CARRIAGE? ONE IS FOR SALE

HONOLULU, T. H., July 14.—(By A. P.)—Anybody need a royal carriage?
L. L. Holstein, administrator of the estate of the late Queen Liliuokalani, has a carriage used by the former queen of Hawaii of which he would like to dispose and for which there doesn't seem to be any taker.

Even the Bishop Museum, to which the carriage was offered, has declined with thanks, as the museum has no room to house such a large vehicle. Besides, the Bishop museum, Holstein has tried and failed to give the queen's carriage to the University of Hawaii, Oahu College, Kamehameha schools, Hawaii Tourist bureau, Ad Club, Outrigger club, Smithsonian institute and the Forresters.

Holstein has asked the court for an order to dispose of other belongings of the late queen, such as furniture, which is stored and which he fears will be attacked by ants and borers if it is not taken in hand and used.

CAR LACK SUSPENDS STEEL PLANT WORK

LONDONDERRY, July 14.—Efforts will be resumed this summer to recover the 4,000,000 pounds of gold still lying in the wreck of the British auxiliary cruiser *Laurentic* which was sunk by a mine off the mouth of Lough Swilly in January, 1917, while on her way to New York. The bullion is in bars each of which is worth 1,200 pounds. Altogether the *Laurentic* carried about 7,000,000 pounds in gold when sunk. It is estimated that about 3,000,000 pounds since has been recovered.

Up to now the weather has been unfavorable and, as the wreck lies in an exposed position, the salvage work can be done only in the finest weather. It is expected that some blasting will be necessary to get at the compartments in which the gold was carried. The work is being done by the *Thuer*, a salvage ship.

IRISH TRUCE DEMANDED BY BRITISH WORKERS

LONDON, July 14.—(Webb Miller, U. P. Staff Correspondent)—A resolution demanding an immediate truce between the warring factions of Ireland and the withdrawal of the British army was adopted in a special meeting of the trades union congress representing thousands of British workers at Westminster yesterday. The resolution proposed a ballot on a general strike unless the troops were withdrawn from Ireland.

Call Special Session.
LONDON, July 14.—(A. P.)—The proposal to employ direct action if necessary to force the government to withdraw its troops from Ireland and cease the manufacturing of munitions for use in Ireland and Russia was defeated today in a special trades union congress called to consider labor's attitude on the Irish question.

WALKER HINES OPENS PARIS BRANCH OFFICE

PARIS, July 14.—Walker D. Hines, former director-general of Railroads, has opened offices in Paris for the purpose of arbitrating the question of river shipping under the German, Austrian and Bulgarian treaties. Mr. Hines was appointed arbitrator for all this work and expects to be in Paris several months. He is accompanied by two secretaries and an assistant, M. Deice Clapin.

Mr. Hines soon will call together the delegates from the various interested countries to discuss the procedure of disposing of the shipping on the Danube, Rhine, Elbe and Oder rivers. Mr. Hines will determine under the German, Austrian and Bulgarian treaties, just what shipping shall be taken from these countries in part payment for reparations and will also distribute the shipping among the allied powers.
