MADE TO MEASURE

WAGE AWARD MAY BE SUBMITTED TO MEN

CHICAGO, July 21.—(A. P.)—Whether the spectre of a nation-wide railway strike has been laid by the \$600,000,000 wage increase granted yesterday to more than 1,800,000 railroad employes last night remained undecided.

Brotherhood officials made no attempt to conceal their disappointment that they did not get all of the billion dollars increase they asked. The belief grew, however, that they would submit the award, probably without recommendation to a referendum of the men. A decision on this point was promised today by W. G. Lee of Cleveland, grand president of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen.

PUGILIST GLAD TO GET BACK, EVEN TO JAIL

LOS ANGELES, July 21.—(A. P.)—Jack Johnson, former heavyweight champion pugilist of the world who crossed the international boundary line from Lower California yesterday, was brought here last night from San Diego by authorities and was in the county jail. He probably will leave here in the custody of federal officers tonight for Chicago to begin serving his sentence of one year for violation of the Mann act.

The negro prize fighter made the trip here by automobile. He was in the custody of Sheriff John C. Cline of Los Angeles county, and Deputy United States Marshal George Cooney of San Diego, to whom he surrendered when he entered the United States. Sheriff Cline said last night that Johnson was not handcuffed at any time. Fear that he would be handcuffed had deterred Johnson from surrender for several days, the sheriff said.
