## HOPE FOR AVERTING CLASH IS DWINDLING

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 12.—(U. P.)—Hope that actual hostilities in Lower California might be averted continues to dwindle with the dispatches from border points, indicating fighting is expected by the end of the week, while warlike preparations continued in Lower California, in expectation of the arrival of Mexican federal troops. General Gonzales, erstwhile leader of the anti-De La Huerta uprising in Mexico, is scheduled to arrive here tomorrow for a conference with local leaders. Federal troops have embarked from Mazatlan and should reach Ensenada by Saturday, reports brought by travelers indicated.
