COMMISSIONERS INSPECT AND ACCEPT NEW ROAD

The completed Sunnyside-Umatilla highway, built by Umatilla county, was accepted today by the county commissioners and will be paid for at once. The road extends for a distance of six miles and the cost approximately \$19,000.

County Judge Marsh and Commissioners Dunning and Anderson went to the east end this morning to inspect the new road and to accept it in company with an engineer from the state highway department. The road is of a new type and is pronounced an excellent piece of work. It serves a large population between Sunnyside and Umatilla and the old road which was in poor condition each winter and spring.

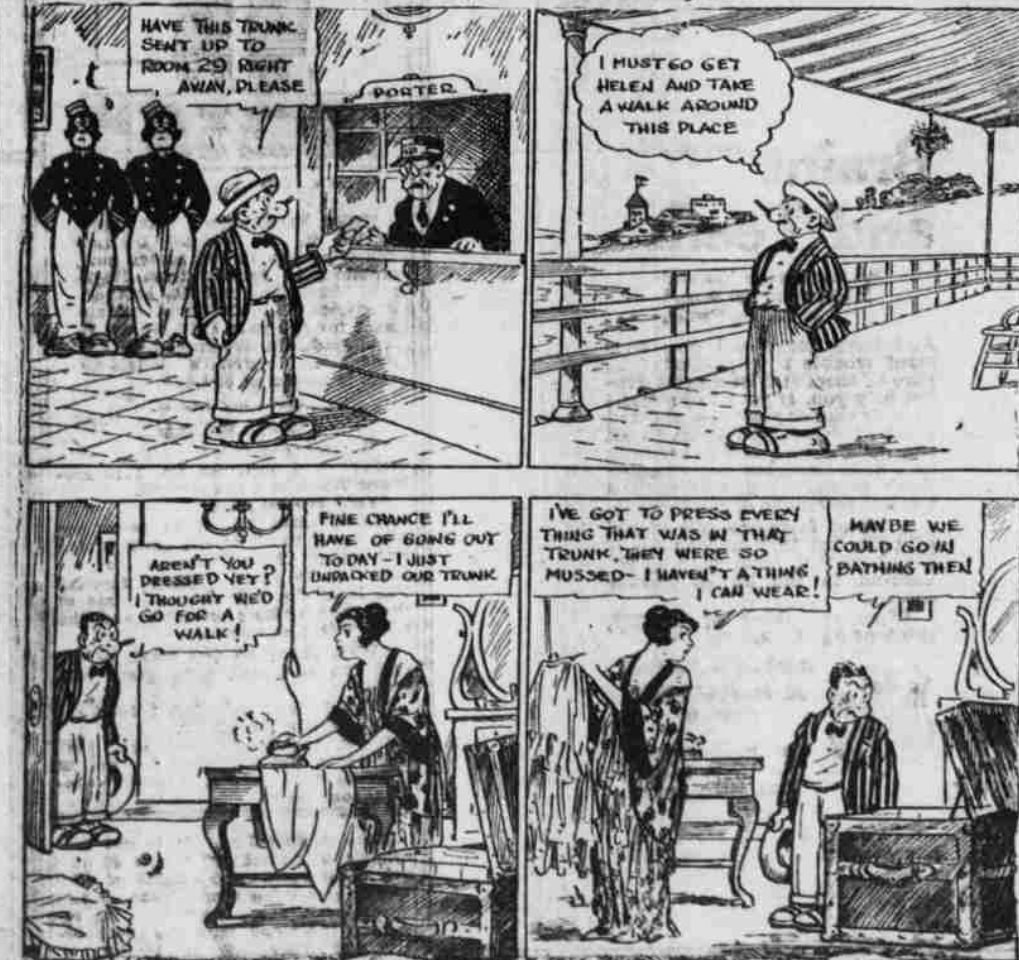
