NEWEST STUDEBAKER IS WONDER IN SIXES

Hailed as the "world's greatest light six," the newest creation of the Studebaker corporation of America, has just made its appearance in Pendleton. The new model was received by Wallace Bros., distributors in this territory and is creating a real sensation on automobile rows.

The local agency already has been swamped with inquiries about the car. On the strength of advance stories booked scores of orders for the light six.

The car is striking in finish and contains many of the features of the higher-priced automobiles. It weighs only 2400 pounds complete. The price is \$1485 at the factory at South Bend, Ind. The new factory has just started operations and will be devoted exclusively to the manufacture of this light six.

"The new light six ranks as the first car at its price equipped with cord tires, which today are on all of the most expensive motor cars. As a matter of fact, numerous features of high-priced motor cars are to be found in the Studebaker light six," said Mr. Wallace.

"A hurried inspection of the model gives only a slight conception of how

much class this new car really has. It looks a great deal longer than it is because of the rakish cut of the body. The high, narrow radiator is particularly pleasing and the lines of the lustrous black enameled body are low and graceful, viewed from any angle. Even the windshield is tipped at a clever angle and the fenders have a neat "hug" which is convincing.

"Outstanding features are such little things not usually found in cars of this price. Like distinctive oval windows in rear of distinctive epoxy top, outside door handles, double dimming headlights, limousine footboard and other luxurious trimmings. The upholstery is of genuine leather and both drivers compartment and tonneau have plenty of leg room. The seats are big, deep and comfortable and the instrument board is well arranged for the convenience of driver. In fact, when you slide in under the wheel you are immediately delighted with the accessibility of clutch pedal, brake, accelerator and starter, while a big, easily handled steering wheel makes you feel that you could drive the car all day without any discomfort.

ALBANIA, WHERE HILLS ARE THICK WITH OLIVES, IMPORT FROM AMERICA

TIRANA, Albania, Aug. 21.—(U. P.)—Albania, where every hillside is thick with olives, wants to import its olives from America. The demand for the American product has grown up since the Americans reached the country and introduced, for the first time, the bottled green olives as a table delicacy.

The Albanians never dreamed of preserving and eating green olives until the Red Cross workers imported a few cases of the fruit, as prepared in America, for their personal consumption and invited their native friends to taste the unfamiliar dainties. Up to that time the people of the country picked their olives only when they were ripe and black and preserved them in strong brine, which robbed them of all their piquant flavor. The fruit was sold by weight from open carts, which stand beside the doorways of the small shopkeepers, collecting all the dust raised by the passing traffic in the grimy streets.

These Albanians who have been favored with a taste of the plump green olives imported from the United States have unanimously declared that the brine-soaked product of their own country cannot compare with the American fruit and that the Albanian market is wide open for green olives preserved by modern methods.

JAPANESE GAIN HOLD ON OREGON PROPERTY

SALEM, Aug. 21.—The adult Japanese population of Oregon has not increased greatly in the last ten years, although there has been a noticeable increase in the birth rate among Japanese, according to report yesterday by Frank Davey of Salem, special investigator for Governor Ocott. The report credits the federal immigration authorities with the view that Japanese adults are coming into Oregon and have apparently entered the country illegally.

LUNCHEON TO CELEBRATE VICTORY FOR SUFFRAGE

SEATTLE, Aug. 21.—(A. P.)—Tennessee's ratification of the federal suffrage amendment was to be celebrated at a luncheon Saturday noon, according to the decision reached by a committee of Seattle suffrage leaders. With Mrs. Edward P. Fick, president of the Washington League of Women Voters and the first president of the Seattle Suffrage Club as chairman, the women were to be entertained by seven speakers. All women present will be identified with suffrage locally. A table was to be reserved for women who pioneered the movement here.

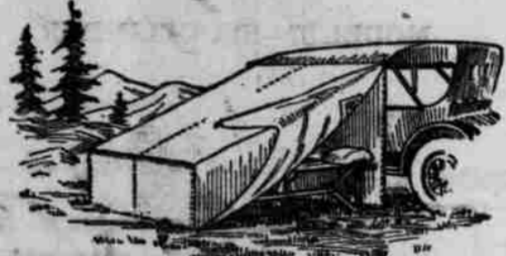
