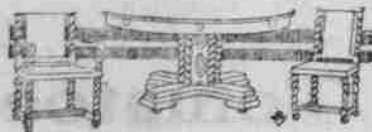

**Removal of Embargo at Hamburg Helps Coffee Market**  
NEW YORK, Aug. 31.—There was some buying for either Brazilian or European account in coffee futures early today accompanied by reports that the Coffee Exchange at Hamburg had petitioned the government to remove the embargo on importations. The market closed some little interest here and the opening was 17 to 22 points higher, but the advance met scattered selling which became little more active following reports of an earlier turn in Santos. December sold off from 3.95 to 3.80 and May from 3.87 to 3.50 or back to about Friday's close with the market closing net unchanged to 4 points lower. September 3.10; Oct. 3.20; Dec. 3.75; Jan. 3.95; Mar. 3.20; May 3.50; July 3.70.

Spot coffee was reported in moderate demand with Rio 7's quoted at a 2-4 and Santos 4's at 14@15.4.

**Reactionary Factors Again Show in Stock Market**  
NEW YORK, Aug. 31.—Factors which contributed to the reactionary movement of recent weeks in the stock market were somewhat again today, prices of the mercurial issues record gross declines of 1 to 2 points.

Events over the week-end, especially the substantial recovery of clearing house actual cash reserves, were mainly of favorable import, but these seemed to be nullified by another flurry in the money market and renewed weakness of foreign exchange.

Signs of more stringent money conditions were forthcoming early in the session, call loans opening at 8 per cent. Long before the final hour, 9 per cent was asked and this was advanced to 10 per cent, last week's maximum, at the close.

**Export Demand Slackens And Chicago Wheat Drops.**  
CHICAGO, Aug. 31.—Wheat slid downward in price today largely as a result of the slowness of export demand. Closing quotations were heavy 2-7-8 to 4c net lower with December 2-3 and March 2-2 1/2. Corn finished 1 1/4 to 1c down; oats off 3-4 to 4c and provisions at a setback of five to 8c.

Talk was current in the wheat pit that foreign governments were having no difficulty in financing their purchases of grain. On the other hand liberal sales to Italy last week were confirmed and also considerable business with other trans-Atlantic countries.
