

### FLY CASTING CHAMPS TO VIE AT COLUMBUS

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 31.—(A. P.)—Fly and bait casting enthusiasts from over the country, including state, national and world champions, will make Columbus their mecca Sept. 1 to 3, when the twelfth annual tournament of the National Association of Scientific Angling Clubs will be held here in connection with the state fair.

The event will be under the auspices of the Columbia Casting Club in connection with the state department of agriculture and the bureau of fish and game. More than \$2500 in trophies will be awarded.

Some of the champions who will participate include Fred Peet, world's champion long distance fly caster, William Stanley, champion bait caster, and C. J. McCarthy, regarded among sportsmen as the world's most consistent fly and bait caster, all of Chicago. Perry Frasier, New York champion fly caster and G. P. Szegal of Kalamazoo, also plan to participate, as well as other famous anglers and fly and bait casters.

### 10 HAWAIIAN YOUTHS AIM AT WORLD TITLE

HONOLULU, T. H., Aug. 31.—(A. P.)—Ten boys picked from the leading polo and racing families of the Hawaiian Islands are being given a ten-year course of training in the hope that, at the end of their course in 1926 they will win the polo championship of the world. Peter Hannon, coach for the Hawaiian Polo and Racing Association, is directing the training, which is now in its fourth year.

Hannon began instructing the boys in the spring of 1916. He went on the theory that youngsters, with years of training together, will play better than boys who take up the game after they grow older. The fathers of the boys liked the idea and the grind of a decade started.

Under the shadow of Diamond Head on the field of Kapiolani Park, the boys, divided into squads of "whites" and "blues" fight out their practices battles. Last year they made their first public appearance and their good showing surprised their parents as well as their trainer.

Not only is Hannon planning to bring the blue ribbon of polo to Hawaii, but he is planning to keep it there, for he has organized a squad of boys younger than his first charges. His first team is composed of boys now between twelve and fifteen years of age. His younger boys are under twelve.

Wallace Waterhouse, son of John Waterhouse, president of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters association, is considered the star of the squad. Like his team mates he has been trained in racing also, and, when he was ten he rode his first winner against the pick of the island ponies. Since then he has been up on five winners.

Hannon has made it a rule that boys cannot come to the field when they neglect their studies in school. As a result, their teachers say, the boys stand high in their academic work and are known for their fair play and good sportsmanship.

### GREYHOUND FANCIERS TO CONGREGATE FOR EVENT

TULSA, Okla., Aug. 31.—(A. P.)—Some of the best known greyhound fanciers in the country are expected to attend the National Coursing meet which will be held here the first week in October. Early entries show 259 greyhounds have been placed in the meet, many of them of national fame and holders of coursing honors.

A contract calling for 500 jackrabbits, which will be conditioned for the meet, will be let. Stakes for the course include both Waterloo and consolation prizes. Sportsmen from New York and California are expected to be present.

An ultra-modern addition to Pendleton's automobile row is the new \$25,000 home of the Kila-Schiller Co., Dodge distributors, located on the corner of Main and Water streets, and now practically complete. ### RAILROADS TO OPERATE INDEPENDENTLY TONIGHT

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31.—(A. P.)—Railroads of the country will begin on their own resources tonight after having cost the government approximately \$190,000,000 monthly for six months in which their earnings were guaranteed by the transportation act. The carriers will be allowed further aid from the government only through loans from revolving funds. Earnings of the roads will fall about \$800,000,000 below their standard return for the period since March 1, according to estimates yesterday by the bureau of railway economics. Fewer than half a score of lines have produced revenue sufficient to equal actual operating expenses, which does not indicate the fixed charges of interest, taxes and dividends. Definite figures on the cost to the government of the earning guarantee provisions of the transportation act will not be known for several months.
