NOTICES

Notice of Street Improvement
Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, held at the Council Chambers in Pendleton, Oregon, on September 15th, 1920, the following resolution was duly adopted: WHEREAS the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 8th day of September, 1920, under directions and by requirements of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named street in said city:

Lincoln Street, from the North line of Haley Street to the South line of Jackson Street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and

WHEREAS the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefore to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work and

WHEREAS the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council properly to be

included within such improvement district and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein, and

WHEREAS the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Lincoln Street either with Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warrentite Bitulithic Pavement on Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, is at this time necessary, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve said portions of Lincoln Street by paving the same with either Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warrentite Bitulithic Pavement on Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, such pavement to be constructed and the surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portions of said Lincoln Street, prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said city on the 8th day of September, 1920, which said plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to, and, be it further

RESOLVED that the Engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Engineer's estimates were made and prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor of said city, in the sum of \$3,790.92, and was filed with the Recorder of said city on the 8th day of September,

1920, is hereby included and hereby referred to, particularly, and be it further

RESOLVED that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvements are prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 8th day of September, 1920, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further

RESOLVED that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further

RESOLVED that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 69," embracing the property benefited and to be assessed for the payment of such improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Description of Assessment District Number 69.
Commencing on the Southwest corner of Lot 6, Block 16, Haley's Addition to Pendleton; thence 300 feet North and parallel with the west line of Lincoln Street; thence 260 feet East and along the South line of Jackson Street; thence 260 feet south and parallel with the east line of Lincoln Street; thence 260 feet west of the

North line of Haley Street to the point of beginning.

And be it further

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution together with the notice that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is on file in the office of the City Recorder be published for a period of ten days in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.

And further notice is hereby given that the Surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot, and parcel of land on account of said work is now on file in the office of the City Recorder, subject to inspection and examination.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids and proposals will be received by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton on and until September 22, 1920, at 5 o'clock p. m. for the improvement of Mark Street from the East Line of Matlock Street to the West line of Bush Street and Perkins Avenue from the South Line of Haley Street to the North Line of Walter's Hill Trace and Logan Street from the South Line of Haley Street to the North Line of Mark Street, Improvement District No. 72, with either

Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warrentite Bitulithic Pavement or Crushed Rock and Crushed Gravel foundation, in accordance to plans and specifications for such improvement now on file in the Office of the City Recorder of the City of Pendleton, Oregon.
