

NEW TRIAL AVERTED AS DEATH ENDS TERM

WALLA WALLA, Oct. 1.—Charles Wilson, aged 54, a colored convict, better known as "Black Diamond" will never be tried for the murder of Charles Newcomb, fellow convict at the state penitentiary.

Black Diamond died in his cell at the state penitentiary last night after a brief illness. Acute indigestion is blamed. Black Diamond, who was an excessive eater, complained of pains in the stomach yesterday afternoon. He was sent to the hospital where he was given aid and after several hours felt so much better that he was returned to his cell. A short time afterwards he died.

Black Diamond was serving time for the murder of a Chinaman in Yakima. On August 1, during a baseball game at the prison, Black Diamond, who was a rabid fan attacked Charles Newcomb, fellow convict and umpire, with a baseball bat, the injuries causing

Newcomb's death. The slayer pleaded not guilty and was to have been tried at the coming term of court on a charge of first degree murder. The funeral will be held at the penitentiary for as far as known he had no relatives in the northwest.
