FIRE PREVENTION TO BE OBSERVED FRIDAY

Fire prevention, which is to be observed with exercises in the local

schools on Friday, is being stressed in the eighth grades of the city in connection with the study of civics. In addition to holding special observance of the day in all the grades, the upper grades are devoting time all month to what is considered a most important topic.

All local schools recently have been equipped with new fire extinguishers in compliance with recommendations

by the state fire marshal. There are fire extinguishers on each floor of all the schools and the older boys in each building have been instructed in their use, so that a part of fire drills includes manning the extinguishers.

Recommendations of the fire marshal in other matters have also been followed out by the city schools and better results were seen in the first fire drill of the year recently held.

CHICAGO, Oct. 5.—(A. P.)—The United States circuit court of appeals today handed down a decision upholding the conviction of William D.

Haywood and 93 other I. W. W. who were sentenced to the Leavenworth prison for obstructing the draft during the war. Haywood and most of the others have been at liberty pending the appeal.

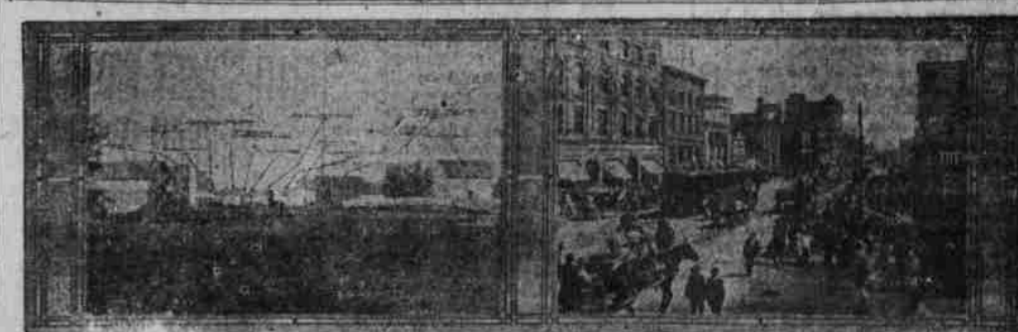
