### WORLD BROTHERHOOD MEETS IN CONVENTION

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—(A. P.)—Brotherhood and its relation to industry, international problems and organized religion will be discussed at the second congress of the World Brotherhood Federation which opens a four day session here today. Delegates are expected from England, Canada, France, Belgium, India, Egypt and Japan.

The first congress of the World Brotherhood was held in London last year and was addressed by Premier Lloyd George, Lord Robert Cecil, Arthur Henderson, British labor leader and a score more of statesmen and educators.

William Ward, the World Brotherhood Commissioner, is in charge of the English delegation to the second congress. He is accompanied by Bishop Nicolai Velimirovitch, of Serbia, who is to speak on the sacrifices made by his country in the world war.

Frank Morrison, secretary of the American Federation of Labor, Ben Bruce, of England and Bishop Francis J. McConnell, of Denver, will speak on brotherhood and industry and Roland S. Morris, American Ambassador to Japan, will discuss brotherhood and citizenship.

### REPORT SHOWS 1243 ATTEND CITY SCHOOLS

There are 1243 children enrolled in the Pendleton schools at this time, the report of City Superintendent H. E. Inlow, prepared as of last Friday, today showed. This is an increase of approximately 80 over the attendance at the same time in the 1919 school year.

The increased enrollment is virtual by all in the grades, the high school showing but five more than last year. There are 297 students taking work above the eighth grade.
