LEGION CELEBRATION AND DANCE PLANNED

An American Legion dance to be held on October 26 and a real celebration of Armistice Day, November 11, were planned Monday by Pendleton Post of the legion at the October meeting in the county library. Committees to work on both events were named and asked to strive for big results for both.

The Pendleton Commercial Association has a committee for Armistice Day which will cooperate with that from the Legion in making November 11 a big day in Pendleton. Word came from Salem yesterday that Governor O'Leary had proclaimed the day a state holiday. A parade and other features probably will be arranged.

Presentation of the Distinguished Service Cross to Dr. Fred A. Lluallien, during the war a captain in the medical corps, will feature the day. Officers from the state headquarters and the regular army are expected to attend and make the presentation. The local man is the only winner of that decoration in Umatilla county.

The dance on October 26 will also be a big affair if the wishes of the post are carried out. Nat Kimball, Harold Brock and Dr. C. W. Lassen were placed in charge of the affair.

The armistice day committee will consist of Lyman Rice, Harold J. Warner and John M. Dolph. They will work with the five men recently appointed from the Pendleton Commercial Association on plans for the celebration.

One of the features of last night's session was a detailed report of legislation and resolutions passed by the national convention of the American Legion. The organization reaffirmed its stand of remaining out of politics as an organization, opposed picture trade immigration of Japanese and strengthened its stand for compensation for former service men disabled. Ferry L. Idleman, delegate from Eastern Oregon to the convention, and adjutant from the local post, made the report.

SENTENCE OF FORMER POLICEMAN FOUND IN LIQUOR RING UPHELD

SEATTLE, Oct. 12.—(A. P.)—Sentence of Ed. Hagen and Walter F. Patton, former policemen, Dick Russell and Ed. Carey, convicted in federal court here of removing 1,770 quarts of bonded liquor from a U. S. customs warehouse March 22, 1919, has been affirmed by the U. S. circuit court of appeals, it was announced today. Hagen was fined \$1,000 and given a sentence of two years, Russell was sentenced to two years, Carey got 15 months and Patton 22 months. The men have all been out on bond since they were sentenced.

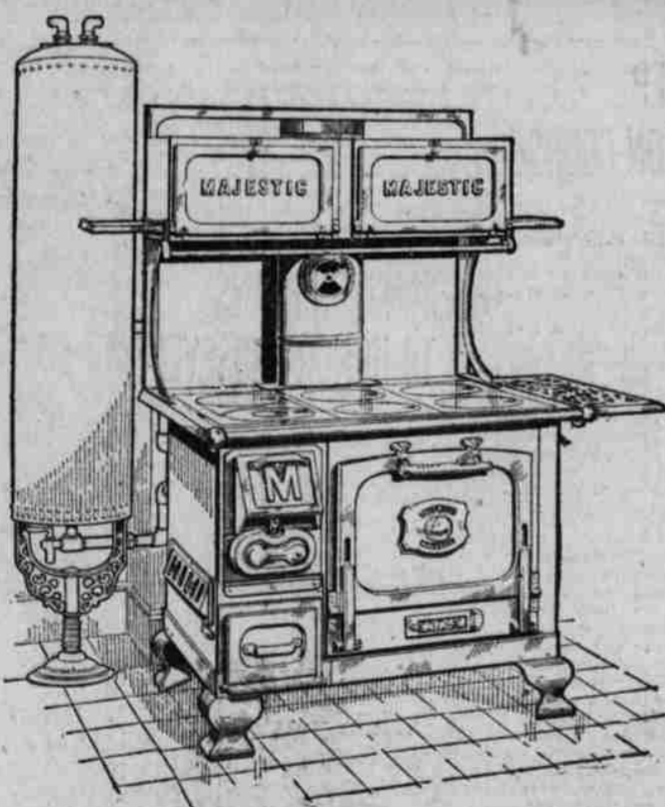

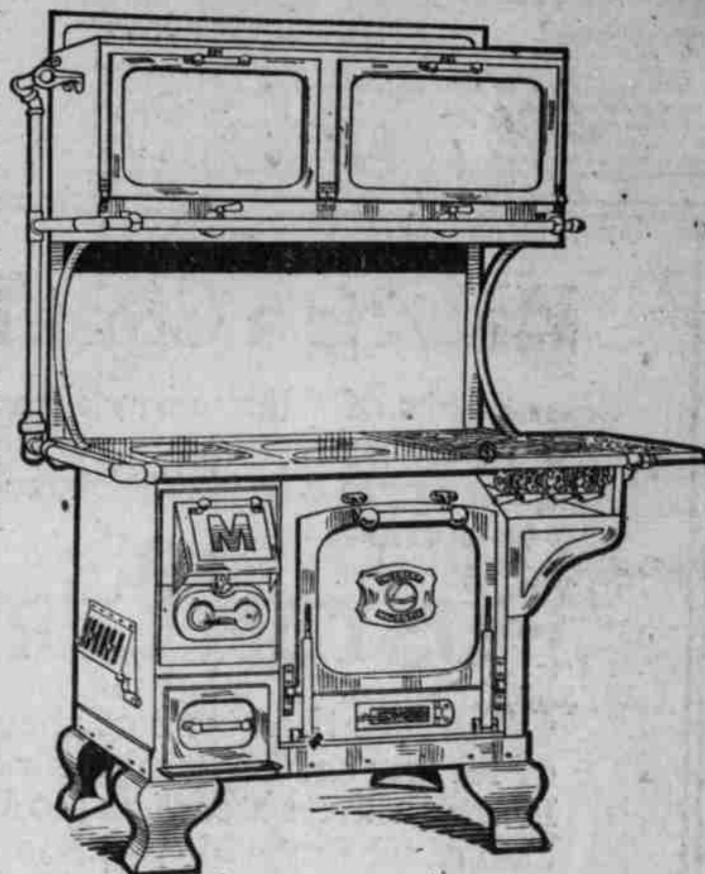
