ENGINEER SCALDED TO DEATH NEAR PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Oct. 22.—(U. P.)—Oscar Bair, an engineer, was scalded to death in a freight train wreck on the Southern Pacific at Park Place, south of Portland, today. He was engineer of a helper engine in the middle of the train. The flange on a gondola car broke, causing our cars and the engine to leave the rails and telescope. Escaping steam scalded Bair to death before he could be extracted. Fireman A. McCall jumped from the locomotive as it left the track and escaped with minor injuries. The wreck delayed all main line S. P. trains for several hours.

The wreck tore up the track for a distance of several hundred feet. Bair was found pinned beneath the right one.

HARDING SAYS SENATE WONT OBEY THE PEOPLE

ENROUTE WITH HARDING, Oct. 22.—(By Raymond Clapper, U. P. Staff Correspondent)—His speaking campaign closed except for four days stumping in Ohio, Senator Harding on his way back to Marion today is confident that his five excursions from the front porch have clinched thousands of doubtful votes. Twenty states several on the borderland of the democratic south have been visited by the republican nominee.

As the campaign draws toward the eleventh hour, Harding is taking a more aggressive attitude on the League of Nations. In all his speeches recently he has emphasized the treaty deadlock, which he says would result from the election of Governor Cox. Not enough votes could be obtained to put through the Cox ratification program in the senate, Harding insists.

BOILER EXPLODES; THREE ARE HURLED TO DEATH

BATAVIA, N. Y., Oct. 22.—(U. P.)—Three members of an engine crew were killed Thursday when the boiler of an engine standing in the New York central yards here exploded. The explosion blew the boiler high in the air and dropped them 20 feet from the wrecked locomotive. Many windows

of the buildings adjoining the yards were shattered.

TRAIN BANDIT TRIO MAKES BRIEF ESCAPE

BUFFALO, N. Y., Oct. 22.—(A. P.)—Three bandits, firing revolvers into the air, robbed passengers of the New York Central train in the East Buffalo yards yesterday. George Sinclair, trainman, was shot and wounded. He tried to bar their way when the bandits jumped on the platform of a pullman. They fired and he fell. Entering the coach, they fired several shots into the roof, marched passengers to one end of the pullman and robbed them of money and jewelry. Twenty minutes after the robbery police arrested John and Stanley Depka, brothers. They were taken to the train and identified by the passengers. *Erwinflaster. 157*
