Green on Important Committee.
County School Superintendent W. W. Green was notified by wire today of his appointment to a committee which will meet with a representative of the United States bureau of education in Portland on Monday, Nov. 1, at the Multnomah hotel at 2:30 p. m. This committee will arrange for the citizens' national conference on education which will be held in Portland on December 4. The appointment was made by J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction.

Will of Pruitt Filed.

His widow, Mrs. Cushi A. Pruitt, is nominated executrix and left the remainder of the estate, which was estimated at \$25,600. An order admitted the will and confirming the appointment of the executrix, was filed in probate court today.

Umatilla County Herd Law

Vote Yes 322

Umatilla County Farmers who are interested in the passage of a just and equitable herd law, desire to call attention of all farmers and the voters of Umatilla County generally, to the Umatilla County Herd law which will be found upon the ballot November 2.

A herd law was enacted by the 1919 legislature. Much objection was raised to it. Later the Attorney General of Oregon, in a written opinion, held it was unconstitutional. We desire to say that the herd law which is to be voted upon November 2 is not the herd law which was held unconstitutional. It is a law initiated in Umatilla County by Umatilla County farmers and taxpayers to be applied to Umatilla County alone. It has no criminal feature; that is to say: nobody will be arrested, fined or jailed for its violation.

The great majority of the voters of the towns and cities are not directly interested in a herd law. The taxpayers and farmers outside of the city boundaries are interested. We feel that because we want a fair law enacted that the people in town, the laborer, the mechanic, the business man, professional man and all others should vote in favor of the law that we desire. We therefore ask our friends to vote 322 yes.

In behalf of Mr. Schanep it is pointed out that he is an estimable man personally and being a member of the bar would understand the legal end of the county work. An objection raised during the primary campaign was that he was rather new in the county.

Both candidates are conducting what might be termed a quiet campaign. A feature about the county judgeship is that the salary is low and the judge pays his own travel expenses. Judge Marsh has been paying his own travel expenses in the county and also when he attends the monthly highway board meetings in Portland. For this reason his travel expenses have taken more than the salary. In view of these facts it is asserted that only a man with other sources of income can afford to take the judgeship and this was one of the reasons that led to Mr. Saylor's being drafted last spring.
