British Pressure Withstood

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—Numerous speculative issues were subjected to further bearish aggressions in the stock market Thursday but recognized leaders of the railway and industrial classes offered a fair degree of resistance to professional pressure.

Selling of motors, shippings, equipments, sugars and several of the utility points coincided with reports of financial needs and other conditions of an unfavorable nature, these mostly indicating additional slowing down of various industries. The more vulnerable shares included Willamette-Oregonland preferred; Pierce Arrow preferred, Atlantic Gulf, General Electric, Sears Roebuck, American Sugar and American Express.

Failure of the Southern Pacific directors to announce the terms of the company's oil segregation plan gave rise to reports of a hitch but these met with prompt denial in which the stock recovered part of its decline.

There was a sharp upward spurt in the final hour based on the ease of call money which fell from 9 to 7 per cent, the lowest rate in several weeks, but this was not realized by another break in foreign exchange. Sales 800,000 shares.

The decline in international rates carried London quotations 4 1/2c under the recent high, while French, Italian, Spanish and Greek rates fell to discounts never before known in the market. South American and Canadian quotations also breaking.

Bonds were comparatively dull and irregular with no special features in any particular division. Total sales, par value, \$15,850,000. Old U. S. bonds unchanged on call.

Stoppage of Foreign Buying Lowers Wheat

CHICAGO, Nov. 12.—(A. P.)—Sharp breaks in the price of wheat took place Thursday owing largely to apparent stoppage of buying for Great Britain and to bearish views of general business conditions. The market closed nervous 5 1/2 to 7 1/2 net lower with Dec. 1.50 1/2 to 1.80 1/2 and March 1.74 to 1.74 1/2. Corn lost 2 1/2 @ 3 1/2 and oats 1c to 2 1/2-3c. In provisions the outcome varied from 7c decline to 45c advance.

Reports that British royal commission had failed to accept overnight offers of wheat were generally taken to indicate that for at least the present any fresh buying for Europe would only be done at substantial declines in price. Weakness of sterling exchange tended further to give an advantage to the bears and so too did announcement of price cutting for commodities other than grain. Under such circumstances speculative selling became aggressive and there was considerable liquidation on the part of holders. Word that trans-Atlantic continental interests had taken 500,000 bushels of wheat
