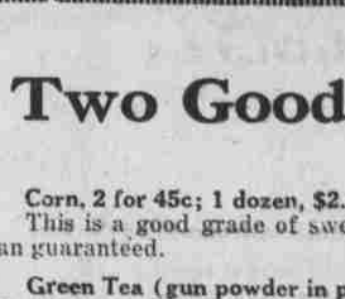

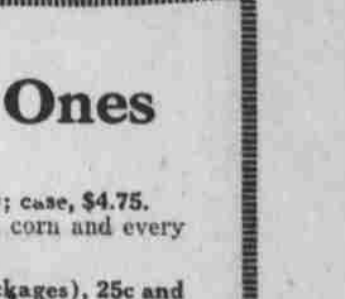

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—After opening at an advance of 1 point to a decline of four points, the market for coffee futures sold about four to six points net lower during the early trading, owing to the unsettled showing of Brazil and scattering liquidation. March sold at 7.65, or even with the low point of Tuesday, but at this level there was some covering and prices later rallied on bullish crop advices from Santos.
