Liquidation on Coffee Futures Lower Market.
NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—After opening at a decline of 11 to 18 points the market for coffee futures rallied to about last night's closing figures and covering but eased off again later under renewed liquidation by brokers with Wall Street and cotton trade connections. There were also reports of lower firm offers on the decline which carried March off from 7.75 to 7.55, or 23 points net lower. That delivery closed 7.57 with the general market showing a net loss of 17 to 21 points. December 6.89; January 7.12; March 7.50; May 7.87; July 8.17; Sept. 8.35. Spot coffee quiet.
