Heavy Selling of Stocks
Marks First Hour of Day.

NEW YORK, Nov. 16—The week in the stock market opened with a resumption of the recent pronounced reactionary trend but this was checked before mid-day after several new low records had been established by speculative industrial and affiliate specialties.

Heavy selling in the first hour, when dealings approximated 400,000 shares, probably included the further weeding out of weakened accounts whose holders were unable or unwilling to respond to calls for extra margins.

Gross recessions extended from 10 to four points but most of these were recovered when buying of a supposedly substantial character set in among the seasoned bulls and industrialists.

Such leaders as U. S. Steel, Reading, Southern Pacific, Northern Pacific, Mexican and Pan-American Petroleum and Royal Dutch finished at gains of liberal fractions to 2 1/2 points while Baldwin after displaying marked recuperative power, made a net loss of 1 1/4. Sales 1,100,000 shares.

News during the Sunday recess brought no relief from long recognized backward conditions in trade and industry. From Montana came word of the closing of the Anaconda copper and zinc mines. Boston reported the passing of the quarterly dividend on Copper Range and the Westinghouse company reduced working hours.

Some comfort was found in the money situation, last Saturday's better clearing house report doubtless contributing to ease shown by call loans. This form of accommodation opened at 8 1/2 per cent, later declining to 7 per cent. The early strain in the stock market extended to bonds, international issues, notably Belgian 7 1/2 and French liberty bonds were active with active domestic issues. Total sales, par value, \$16,775,000.
