### COFFEE FUTURES OPEN LOWER

**Hally, Then Slump Again.**

**NEW YORK, Nov. 18**—After opening with a decline of 3 to 4 points coffee futures rallied slightly on covering inspired by the firmer ruling of sterling and Rio exchange rates. It soon weakened again, however, owing to the unsettled ruling of the markets for stocks and cotton with March selling off from 7.78 to 7.61 or 18 points net lower. There were also reports of an easier ruling in the cost and freight market and last prices were nearly the lowest of the day, showing a net decline of 12 to 17 points. December 6.92; January 7.15; March 7.52; May 7.96; July 8.28; September 8.49.

Spot coffee was nominally unchanged at 7 1/4 for Rio 7s and 10 3/4 to 11 1/2 for Santos 4s.
