### WASTE PAPER TO BE SAVED IN PENDLETON

Systematic collection and conservation of waste paper in Pendleton will begin tomorrow when Pendland Brothers, as local agents for the Independent Paper Stock Company of Portland, will place collection bags in stores of this city. After collection, the paper will be baled by Penlands and shipped to Portland. Local merchants welcome the new system as it will save them expense, the present method being to haul the paper to the city dump grounds at some cost. D. S. Bennion, manager of the Portland firm, who is here today to establish the agency, points out that the collection of paper in bags is a step forward in conservation. He states that the burning of one ton of paper is equal to the destruction of two tons of coal or a ton and a half of wood. He emphasizes also that the bag method greatly reduces the fire hazard, is more cleanly and more economical. He estimates that Pendleton should ship a car of waste paper every month. Mr. Bennion's firm, which ships paper to the Northern Board & Paper Co., makers of roofing, boxes, etc., collects 7000 tons of paper a month from Pacific coast territory and 1500 tons a month from the Northwestern territory. It is planned also to have the schools collect paper, and if the system is adopted schools will receive money for magazines, papers and other higher grades of paper. H. E. Inlow, city school superintendent, will place the matter before the school principals and if they agree, the children will collect magazines and papers, and sell them as a means of revenue for school enterprises. It was the Independent Paper Stock Co. which bought the carload of paper collected in local schools last year. During the fall, the company received 200 tons of paper from the Portland schools, 100 from Spokane schools and 200 from Seattle schools.
