NOTICE OF PROPOSED STREET IMPROVEMENT
Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, held at the Council Chambers in Pendleton, Oregon, on November 24, 1920, the following Resolution was duly adopted, viz:

WHEREAS the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 10th day of November, 1920, under directions and by requirement of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named streets in said city:

Madison street from the North line of Raleigh street to the South line of Jackson street, together with the estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof with a statement of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and,

WHEREAS the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work, and

THEREAS the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council property to be included within such improvement district and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein, and,

WHEREAS the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of said street, either with Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warrenite Bitulithic Pavement on Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, is at this time necessary, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve said portions of said Madison street by paving the same with either Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warrenite Bitulithic Pavement on Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, such pavement to be constructed and the surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portions of said Madison street, prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said city on the 10th day of November, 1920, which said plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to, and be it further,

RESOLVED that the Engineer's estimates of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Engineer's estimates were made and prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor of said city, in the sum of \$122,800 and were filed with the Recorder of said city, on the 10th day of November, 1920, is hereby included and be it further,

RESOLVED that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvements, as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, on the 10th day of November, 1920, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further, resolved that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further,

Resolved that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 75" embracing the property benefited and they be assessed for the payment of such improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Description of Assessment District No. 75
Commencing at the Northwest corner of Intersection of Raleigh and Madison Streets; thence West 100 feet on the North line of Raleigh Street; thence North 200 feet and parallel with the West line of said Madison Street; thence East 200 feet on the South line of Jackson Street; thence South 200 feet and parallel with the East line of Madison Street; thence West 160 feet on the North line of Raleigh Street to the place of beginning.

And be it further RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution together with the notice that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is on file in the office of the City Recorder be published for a period of ten days in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.

And further notice is hereby given that the Surveyor's estimate of the cost of said proposed improvement to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land on account of said proposed improvement is now on file in the office of the city recorder, subject to inspection and examination.
