Local Store Quotes
Low Price on Ham
A low retail price of 40 cents a pound for best quality smoked ham is quoted by one local store. Other stores are quoting the standard brands of ham at 45 cents a pound.

Japanese oranges are selling in Pendleton stores for 45 cents a dozen. They are the genuine Japanese orange.

A carload of potatoes from the Grande Ronde valley arrived here yesterday. The variety is known as the Netted Gem and sells for \$2.25 for a 100 pound sack. The tubers are of good size and quality.

Heaviness, Hesitation and Strength Seen in Stocks.
NEW YORK, Dec. 3.—The successive stages of yesterday's active stock market were characterized by hesitation, heaviness and intermittent strength, selling for profits, however, materially reducing many gains at the irregular close.

Fruition of the so-called Southern Pacific "melon" overnight seemed to exercise little influence. Southern Pacific opening at a loss of 1 3-8, extending this to more than three points at midday and displaying further heaviness later when the balance of the list tended toward higher levels. Its final quotation of 105 1-2 showed a net loss of 4 5-8 points.

"Rights" to Southern Pacific rose and fell within a narrow radius of yesterday's closing price of 23 and shares of the Pacific Oil company, which is to take over the oil lands of the Southern Pacific, were quoted on the "when issued" basis at 20 to 25.

Associated Oil, whose shares are to be merged with Pacific Oil, scored an early gain of four points, a small part of which was forfeited later.

Final prices of Mexican Petroleum and the two Pan-American petroleum showed gains of 3 1-2 to 4 points.

Among steels, equipments, copper and unclassified specialties there was no definite trend after midday, when advances of 1 to 3 points were scored, probably at the expense of the shorts who are suffered in the rise of shipplings.

Total sales approximated 1,000,000 shares.

The money market pursued an even course, all call loans being again at 7 per cent and most time loans, chiefly for moderate sums at 7 to 7 1-2. Foreign exchange presented no special feature but the low ratio of liability reserves reported by the Bank of England was a matter of general comment.

Chicago Board Figures
Europe Has Overbought.
CHICAGO, Dec. 3.—Anxiety as to whether European buying of wheat in the U. S. has not already been overdone led to sensational advance in prices Thursday. The market jumped up 1 1/2 a bushel in some cases and closed unsettled at 6 1-2 to 9 3-4 net gain with December 1.69 to 1.59 1-2 and March 1.64 3-4 to 1.66 1/4. Other leading staples too all finished here, corn up 1 7-8 to 3 3-8 and oats 1 3-8 to 2 1-8 to 2 1/4 and provisions 20 to 75c.

According to an estimate by one of the leading firms on the board of trade there remains in this country at present only 60,000,000 bushels available for export and for July 1 carry-over after allowing for domestic needs, whereas the usual carry over alone is 75,000,000 bushels. With attention chiefly focused on this estimate, a general stampede of the bears to the bull side of the market began as soon as business opened. Bullish sentiment was further emphasized by a report that the bulk of the new Australian crop had been purchased in advance and that Argentine harvest weather was unfavorable. Much notice was also taken of a "buy a barrel of flour" movement and of the fact that the convening of congress on Monday would be followed by the introduction of many bills designed to afford aid to the farmers. Frenzied purchasing lasted throughout the day, but lessened somewhat in the final hour.
