### MANITOBA DOGS HAVE CHANCE TO BE WINNER

THE PAS, Manitoba, Dec. 4.—(A. P.)—Owners of Manitoba dog teams are of the belief that a recent extension of the Hudson Bay Derby course here will enable their animals to show their best form in the next derby which will be held March 1, 1921 over the 200 miles of snow trails between The Pas and Elniflon and back. Last year's race, on a course not much over 100 miles, was won by a team of Alaskan Dogs.

Dogs have become very expensive, last spring pups selling at \$200 for five, and full grown and trained animals from \$75 to \$100 each.

Since the Nome All-Alaska Sweepstakes was abandoned, the Hudson's Bay Derby has become the big sporting event of the white trails of the north.

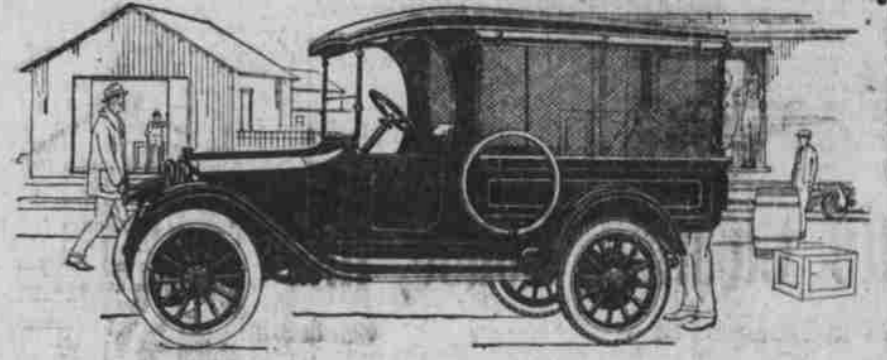

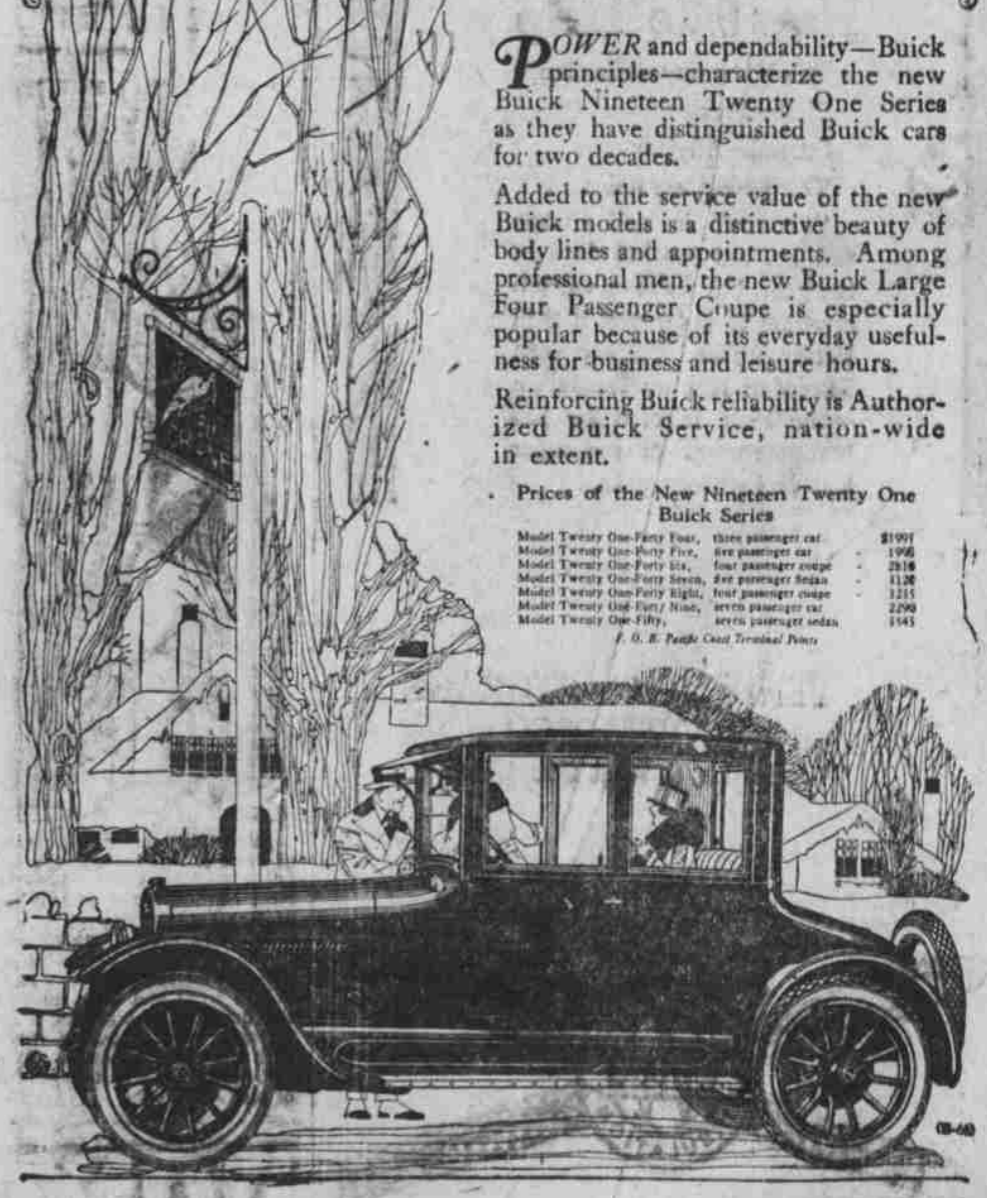
