WOMEN GREET BISHOP
The rectory of the Church of the

Redeemer housed an interesting gathering yesterday when women of the parish and friends were asked to greet Bishop Frederick W. Keator, of the diocese of Olympia. The bishop talked of the work of the woman's auxiliary and touched informally on some of the experiences enjoyed by Mrs. Keator and himself on their visit to England to attend the Lambeth conference of bishops held in London last summer. The entire Anglican church was represented and the gathering included churchmen from many parts of the world. Bishop Keator told of interesting visits to Lambeth palace, the home of the bishop of London, to Fulham Palace, and to the famous old Eaton college. He described also the impressive processions held in Canterbury Cathedral.

The world representation agreed in its favor of the Unity plan for churches, and Bishop Keator was appointed a member of a committee of 70 to frame important resolutions to that end. The conference was in session in London for five weeks. The bishops talk was followed yesterday by an informal tea hour.

FIFTEEN TOWNS OF COUNTY CARRYING ON HOME BUREAU WORK

Hot Lunches for Schools, Dressmaking, Fireless Cookery and Emergency Service Are Directed by Agent.

Fifteen Umatilla county towns are carrying on Home Bureau work under the direction of Mrs. Edith G. Van Deusen, home demonstration agent, according to a recent report made by Mrs. Van Deusen showing the work in the various communities.

At Athena, the Civic Club has a committee which will meet later with Mrs. Van Deusen and arrange for convenient dates for the activities adopted in an open meeting December 8. Mrs. Van Deusen has given two lectures at the club, one on civic work

and the other on interior decoration.

Club Is Organized
The Neighborhood Club is the organization through which Mrs. Van Deusen carries on her work at Columbia. Clothing work has been done in Columbia and the school serves hot lunches to all its pupils. The school won first place in the hot lunch contest at the Hermiston Dairy and Hog show.

Echo has had a dress form school and has adopted other projects, working through the Ladies Aid. Hermiston had a clothing school, demonstrations an exhibit at the Field Day and the Dairy and Hog Show. The Parent Teacher Association is at work on the hot lunch project for the schools, and millinery and sewing schools are on the calendar for early spring.

Hot Lunches Installed
Dress forms, dressmaking and millinery schools have been held in Milton, many of the Freewater women attending also. The Grove school at Milton has installed hot lunches, while the Freewater school serves hot lunch each day to about 65 children, under the supervision of the domestic science teacher.

A dress form class and a demonstration of the fireless cooker marked the Helix program. Three fireless cookers were made. Schools in sewing, dress forms and clothing were held at Umatilla. Hot lunches have been installed in the school. Demonstrations of the fireless cooker were held at Nolia, while at Pilot Rock a dress form school and the organization of classes for other projects later in the spring complete the program.

Pendleton Work Noted
In Pendleton, women were given instruction in the making of dress forms, sewing, millinery and child feeding. Emergency work was done during the influenza epidemic. Mrs. Van Deusen gave lectures at the teachers' institute. Two groups in Stanfield have adopted a community work program. The first project will be dress form making. At Umatilla the home demonstration agent assisted in organizing a Home Bureau which held successful classes in dress form making, clothing and millinery. A child welfare program was adopted and the hot lunch installed.

To Hold Meeting
Dress forms and dressmaking occupied the program at Weston. Weston will have a community meeting later and will adopt a year's program. Weston Mountain has had classes in dress forms and dress making and has asked for both clothing and millinery schools.
