Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton held at the Council Chambers in Pendleton, Oregon, on December 8th, 1920 the following Resolution was duly adopted, viz:

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 5 day of December, 1920, under directions and by requirement of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named street in said city:

Clay Street from the north line of Alta Street to the South line of Court Street, together with the estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement, and

WHEREAS, the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefore to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and

WHEREAS, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited as in the judgment of the Common Council properly to be included within such improvement district and no property is excluded therefrom which should properly be included therein; and

WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of said street, either with Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warren's Bitulithic Pavement or Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, is at this time necessary, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve said portions of said Clay Street by paving the same with either Gravel Bitulithic Pavement, Concrete Pavement or Warren's Bitulithic Pavement on Crushed Rock or Crushed Gravel foundation, such pavement to be constructed and the surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portion of said Clay Street, prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, or filed with the Recorder of said city on the 8th day of Dec., 1920, which said plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to, and be it further,

RESOLVED that the Engineer's estimates of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Engineer's estimates were made and prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor of said city, in the sum of \$882.20 and were filed with the Recorder of said city on the 8th day of Dec., 1920, is hereby included and hereby referred to particularly, and be it further,

RESOLVED that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement, as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 8th day of Dec., 1920, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further,

RESOLVED that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, so specially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for the payment of the costs thereof, and be it further,

RESOLVED that an assessment district be hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 77," embracing the property benefited and to be assessed for the payment of such improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Description of Assessment District known as Improvement District No. 77 Beginning at the Southwest corner of Lot 7, Block 2, Reservation Addition to Pendleton, thence 140 feet 4 1/8 in. in a Northerly direction and parallel with the west line of Clay Street; thence 275.84 feet in an Easterly direction and along the South line of Court Street; thence 20 feet, 11 1/2 in. in a Southwesterly direction and parallel with the East line of Clay Street; thence 246 ft. in a Southwesterly direction and along the North line of Alta Street to the point of beginning.
