HARDER GAMES LIKELY ON 1921 SCHEDULE OF BIG EASTERN ELEVEN

Harvard Example of Defeating Easy Opponents Found to be in Disfavor and Major Teams Seek Worthy Foemen.

NEW YORK, Dec. 17.—(By Henry L. Farrell, U. P. Staff Correspondent)—Glorious in modern football is not so much a matter of how many you beat as who you beat.

A successive string of victories down a velvet-paved road is not convincing and the big eastern eleven are beginning to realize it.

Next season will see harder schedules and a greater number of big inter-sectional games than ever have been arranged.

Ohio State sidetracked Harvard offered the Buckeyes a game, but refused to play in Columbus the following year and the Ohio officials declined the invitation.

Scraper and Dartmouth likewise are looking to the west for victors on the promise to give them return games in 1921.

Yale made no friends by cancelling relations with Boston College, a team which beat them two years in succession. But Boston will have no trouble getting big games.

OLD STARS FOUND FIRST IN FIELDING PERCENTAGE

"Stuff" McInnis, Boston, led the first basemen of the American league for 1920 in fielding with the splendid average of .986, 91 of his 1077 accepted chances being assists.

Eddie Collins of Chicago is first among the second basemen with a percentage of .976 and for the fourth time in his career in the American league he leads all in the number of accepted chances, this year's record reading 526.

Larry Gardner of the champion Indians has an average of .974 at third base with 523 accepted chances, while Everett Scott is first among the shortstops with 826 accepted chances for an average of .973.

When Sam Rice accepted 478 chances—154 putouts and 24 assists—for an average of .969 he established a new major league record for outfielders. The nearest approach to this phenomenal performance is Max Carey, Pittsburgh, 468, 1917; Oscar Felsch, Chicago, 464, 1917; and Tris Speaker, Boston, 452, 1914.

This season Rice is far in advance of his nearest rival, William Jacobson, St. Louis, who handled 224 putouts and 18 assists. Felsch, Chicago is third with 282 put outs and 25 assists and leads in percentages with an average of .981 being charged with but 8 errors.
