SHIPPING BOARD SALES

NOW TOTAL 430 SHIPS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—(A. P.)—The government up to Dec. 4 had sold 430 merchant ships totaling 2,157,124 deadweight tons for \$297,818,293, according to a summary issued last night by the shipping board. Since July 15, when the board's last summary was issued, sales were increased by 40 vessels of 96,705 deadweight ton, which brought \$67,745,372.

GOLD MINING REACHES LOWEST EBB IN SOUTH

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 24.—(A. P.)—Gold mining, an industry which virtually brought California into existence, has reached the lowest ebb in the history of the state. Fletcher Hamilton, state mineralogist, announced here recently after a tour of the state.

"One appears to be traveling in the wake of a pestilence," Mr. Hamilton said "in visiting the mining districts where the industry was founded, and from where nature's golden harvest has been poured forth for the past seventy years."

Towns and whole countries are being depopulated. Mines are being allowed to fill with water and mills and reduction plants are being abandoned to the elements.

Mr. Hamilton pointed out that gold production has decreased because the price of gold has never joined the upward rush of other prices. The gold miner, he said, receives no more for his product than he did fifty years ago.

Passage of the McFadden bill before congress, providing for an excise tax of \$10 an ounce on new gold used in manufactured articles, was advocated by Mr. Hamilton as one means of stimulating the gold production. The tax would be given to the gold miners, according to the bill.

CHRISTMAS PRESENTS ARE LOOT OF BANDITS

CHICAGO, Dec. 24.—(A. P.)—Christmas presents, valued at several thousand dollars, were stolen yesterday by three armed bandits who drove away with a delivery truck from a large department store after robbing the driver of \$30.

The robbery brought to a close a day during which numerous holdups and robberies were added to Chicago's growing list of holiday crime activities.
