## BOLSHEVIK AGENTS TRY TO ENMESH AMERICANS

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 25.—(A. P.)—Bolshevik agents at Samsoon are adopting an unfriendly attitude toward Americans. It is reported by Colonel J. F. Coombs, director of the Near East Relief, who has just returned from that Black Sea port. "The soviet representatives," Col. Coombs says, endeavored to persuade two Russians who were officers in the imperial army and who are now chauffeurs for the Near East Relief, to sign documents alleging that the Americans had provided Gen. Wrangel with supplies. In spite of threats the officers refused to sign. Colonel Coombs declared the Turks gradually were introducing the soviet system in Anatolia and continued: "The communist party in Angora is opening branches in the principal towns of Asia Minor. A communist court, composed of three judges with full powers, is pronouncing the severest penalties against suspects. This terrorism also is applied to the opponent of Turkish nationalist regime with the result that nationalist authority is becoming stronger."

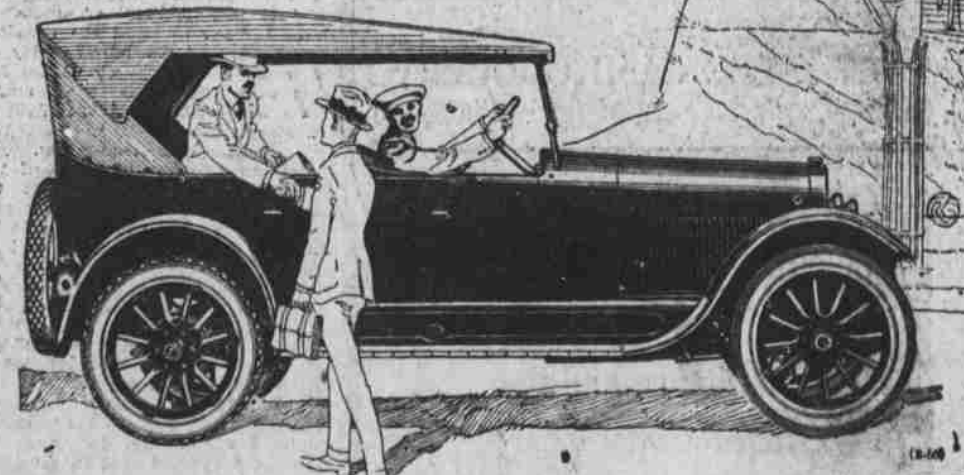
