BOLSHEVIK AGENTS TRY TO ENMESH AMERICANS

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 25.—(A. P.)—Bolshevik agents at Samsoun are adopting an unfriendly attitude to-ward Americans, it is reported by Colonel J. P. Coombs, director of the Near East Redef, who has just returned

from that Black Sea port.

"The soviet representatives," Col.
Coombs says, endeavored to persuade
two Russians who were officers in the
imperial army and who are now chautfeurs for the Near East Relief, to sign documents alleging that the Americans had provided Gen. Wrangel with sup-piles. In spite of threats the officers

refused to sign."

Colonel Coombs declared the Turks gradually were introducing the soviet system in Anatolia and continued: "The communist party in Augora is

opening branches in the principal towns of Asia Minor. A communist court, composed of three judges with full powers, is pronouncing the sever-est penalties against suspects. This terfrorism also is applied to the opponent of Turkish nationalist regime with the result that nationalist au-thority is becoming stronger."




