## COMMUNITY TREE HELD AT ADAMS ON THURSDAY

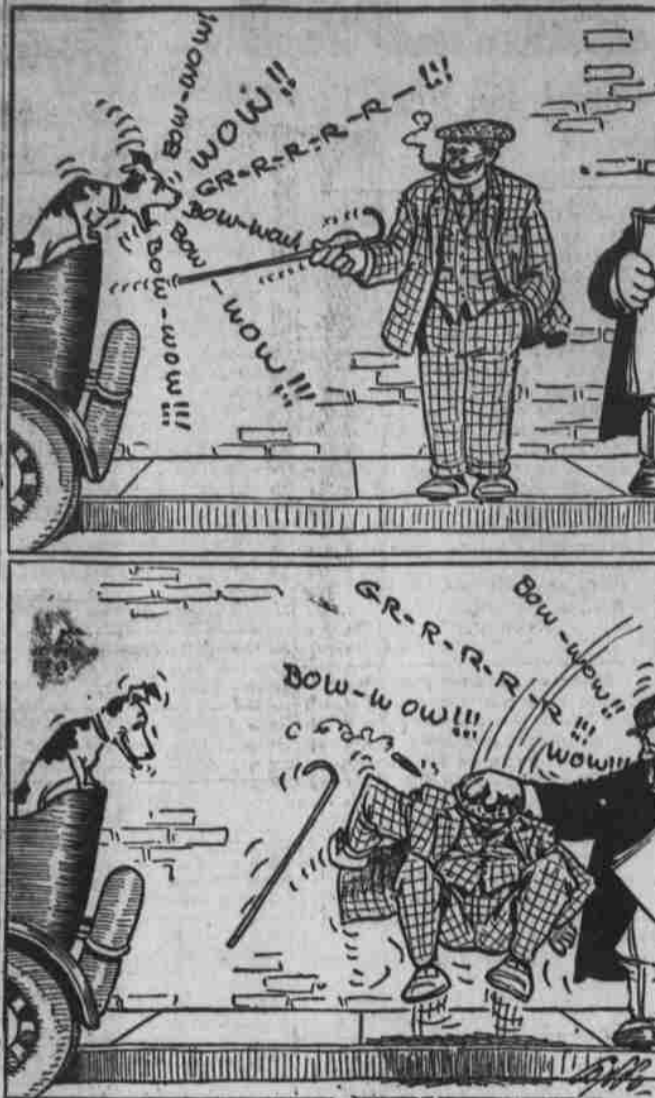

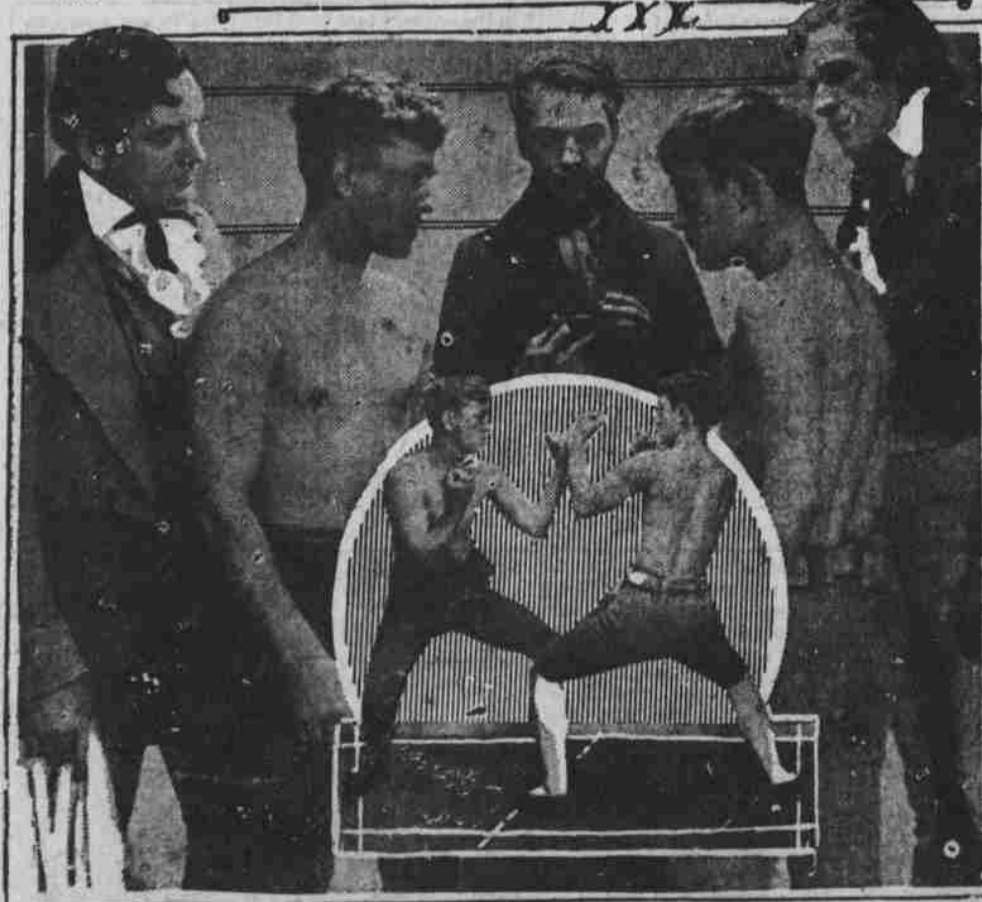
## LOVERS WED AFTER HALF CENTURY'S SEPARATION
