

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13.-Failure of the shipping board to make accur-ate inventories of its surplus materials valued at millions of dellars, is costing the government a vast sum, the board's operations was informed to-day by C. R. Taylor of the comptroller's department. He said he "doubt-ed" whether officials of the board 'know exactly what is stored in vari-

us warehouses."
The shipping board is buying supplies at high prices in the open mar-ket, Taylor charged, when the materials in many instances are piled in its

Taylor directed his criticism at the division of supply and sales, whose head, H<sub>k</sub> B, Miller, testifying later, conditions are not satisfac-The latter added that inventories
