BELFAST, Jan. 17.—(Crown forces Saturday went through South Armagh scene of recent alleged Sinn Fein activities. Troops and constabulary of the Ulster "Specials" cooperated. Every road was under supervision. More than 300 prisoners were taken, but after a rigorous examination only 40 were held.

PHILIPPINE'S GOVERNOR WILL RETURN TO U. S.

MANILA, P. I., Jan. 17.—Governor-General Francis Burton Harrison of the Philippines announced today that he will leave the Philippines for the United States March 27. He will make the trip via the Suez canal and London. There is much speculation here regarding the new governor-general to be appointed. It is said in official circles here that unless the vice-governor, Charles E. Yeater, who is now in the United States, returns to the Philippines before the departure of Governor Harrison, it will be necessary for President Harding prior to March 27 to appoint a resident of the Philippines as acting governor. A resident of the continental United States would not have time to reach the islands prior to the departure of Governor Harrison.

VANDERLIP APPOINTMENT WOULD PLEASE NIPPON

TOKIO, Jan. 17.—News dispatches stating that President-elect Harding contemplates the appointment of F. A. Vanderlip as Ambassador to Japan have been well received. Yonozo 'Choho, an independent organ, says: "Mr. Vanderlip is pro-Japanese and his appointment at the present, when relations between Japan and the United States threaten to become complicated, would promote friendship."
