FOREIGN ATTITUDE TO U. S. MARINE REVEALED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—Direct and implied criticism of the attitude of British and other foreign shipping interests toward the newly created American merchant marine permeated today's session of the second annual convention of the National Merchant Marine Association.

Senator Randall of Louisiana, as president, opened the convention with a plea for "an American merchant marine built, owned and operated by Americans without the faintest suspicion in their makeup of foreign sympathy," and Homer L. Ferguson, Newport News shipbuilder, concluded the day's program with the declaration that the United States, if necessary, should adopt discriminatory legislation to hold its place on the seas.

The bomb shell, however, was exploded by Senator Jones of Washington, chairman of the senate commerce committee, and author of the merchant marine act, who declared that the International Mercantile Marine company was bound by an agreement with the British admiralty to conduct its business "in the interest of the British government and British trade." To support his statement, the senator read the text of an agreement, which he said the International marine had entered into in 1904 for 20 years and followed this with charges of attempts by British interests aided, he said, by certain American interests "to destroy the American merchant marine."

Senator Jones' declaration brought an immediate reply from P. A. S. Franklin, president of the International Mercantile Marine, who accused the senator of being "unfair," and added: "All of these agreements to which he refers, have been before the shipping board and have been approved. Judge Payne, when he was chairman, passed upon them and said they were quite satisfactory."

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 21.—(A. P.)—A state tax of 12 per cent on gross gate receipts of all racing associations was proposed in a bill introduced in the legislature today.
