TOOTH MARKS ON POCKET BOOK, INDICATE SLAYER

PARLAN, Ky., Jan. 25.—(U. P.)—Marks of human teeth bitten deep into a pocketbook may decide the faith of Dr. O. C. Winnes, former state veterinarian, on trial here, charged with murdering Lura Parsons, a teacher. The pocketbook was found near where she was slain. Cut into the alides are marks of teeth, such as might be made by a person clutching with the teeth in a frenzy. The defense says there are undoubtedly the marks of the murderer. Winnes says he is prepared to prove they are not the marks of his teeth.

CRIMINAL SYNDICALISM LAW UPHOLD IN COURT

OLYMPIA, Wash., Jan. 25.—(U. P.)—Washington's criminal syndicalism statute, passed by the 1918 legislature, was upheld in an opinion handed down by the state supreme court today. In affirming the conviction of Mike Henneey in superior court of Clark county, based upon Henneey's alleged affiliation with the industrial workers of the world.

Answering the contention of the defendant that the syndicalism act is an attempt to punish constructive treason, the court held that "treason as defined by the constitution does not deprive the state legislature of the power to enact laws to prevent the teaching of crime, violence or sedition as a means of overcoming the existing order of government."
