CONCERTED ACTION FOR WAGE REDUCTION STARTS

CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—(U. P.)—The first concerted action of the railroads of the country to obtain a decrease in wages paid employees was taken here by E. T. Whittier, spokesman for the railroads before the United States labor board. Whittier demanded that piece-work be restored and that the flat rate be abolished. The railroads believe if their request is granted it will not only mean a cut in the amount of wages paid employees, but will also call for greater efficiency.

Whittier plan made on the eve of the scheduled meeting of the labor committee of railway executives here which is expected to discuss further demands for wage reductions to be made before the federal labor board. His demand made in connection with the attack on railroad administration in announcing piece-work, which railroads claim reduced the output from 25 to 30 per cent.

Board Denies Cuts
CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—(U. P.)—No haste cuts in wages of railway employees will be made by the United States railway labor board, it was announced. The board set Feb. 16 as the date for a further hearing on the petition of the Atlanta, Birmingham and Atlantic railway employees to prevent the railroad from cutting wages. The board advised the employees and officials of the road to get together in the meantime and iron out differences.

TARIFF BILL FIGHT NOW QUESTION OF STRATEGY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—(U. P.)—The senate fight over the emergency tariff bill is out in the open, having become a question of strategy with its democratic opponents. While Senator Penrose and other republican leaders are pushing for a vote, the democrats were considering two courses. One was to adopt Senator Harrison's bill as a party movement. The other to add the republicans in getting the vote, and then put on them the responsibility for results of the measure, which, its friends and foes agree will be to raise prices. The drawback to the latter course is that democrats really favor the measure.
