VALPO U. GETS FIGURES ON COLLEGE GRADUATES

VALPARAISO, Ind., Jan. 31.—(A. P.)—Thirty-six per cent of the members of congress, fifty-five per cent of the Presidents of the United States and fifty-four per cent of the vice-presidents have been college graduates, according to an announcement made by Dr. C. C. D. 144, dean of Education of the Valparaiso University. Dr. Borst also made the statement that there is only one percent of college graduates in our male population of graduate age. "Nearly fifty-five per cent of all cabinet members, sixty-nine per cent of the justices of the supreme court and eighty-five per cent of the chief justices have also been furnished from this one per cent," said Dr. Borst.

CHICAGO WOMAN WILL RIVAL ANNE MORGAN

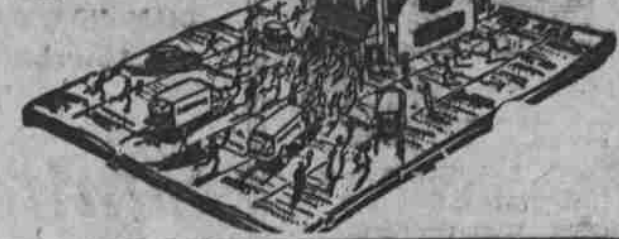
