PEKING, Feb. 1.—The Peking government has received a note from Dr. Sun Yat-sen, head of the newly organized "extraordinary" government of South China at Canton, making three demands which he says the Peking government must meet before the Canton group will entertain the proposition for renunciation of the country.

The demands are for dismissal from the Peking administration of all militarists, including premier Chin Yuan-ping who is also Minister of War; cancellation of the mandate recently issued by the Peking government announcing the union of the two factions in North and South China, and a pledge not to negotiate and further foreign loans.

The government, according to a high authority, considers the demands impossible and an evidence of a lack of desire on the part of the southerners to encourage peace efforts.
