INCOME TAX WILL CUT HARDING PAY \$18,000
WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—(A. P.)—W. G. Harding as president will receive something like \$18,000 less compensation annually than Woodrow Wilson received. The treasury will pay Mr. Harding the same amount it pays Mr. Wilson—\$75,000—but internal revenue bureau officials say Mr. Harding must return nearly one-fourth in income tax.

THE HAGUE, Feb. 3.—(A. P.)—An indictment of "blue Sunday" advocates was returned in the report of a committee of the second chamber of the Dutch parliament on a bill proposing to forbid amusements, curling, tennis, etc., on Sundays.

BELGIAN RULERS ARE GREETED BY SPANIARDS
MADRID, Feb. 3.—(A. P.)—The king and queen of the Belgians were given an enthusiastic welcome yesterday. King Alfonso XIII, Queen Victoria and high officials met the visitors and the route to the palace was lined with troops in full dress uniform. The visitors were loudly acclaimed and showed high appreciation of the honors accorded them.
