JEWTRAW WINS SKATING TITLE AT SARANAC, N. Y.

SARANAC LAKE, N. Y., Feb. 4.—(A. P.)—Charles Jewtraw of Lake Placid, earned the national amateur skating championship title Thursday by winning the 440-yard and three-mile events in the close of a three-day tournament.

Point winners for seniors in the meet were Jewtraw 129, Roy McWhorter of Chicago 96, Charles German of St. John, N. H., 80; Joe Moore of New York 39, Mike Goodman of Winnipeg 29, R. Donohy of Minneapolis 19.

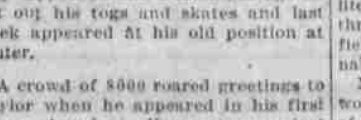
The 440-yard event was the sensation not only of the day but of the meet. Jewtraw, McWhorter and German were lunched at the finish and literally dove for the tape. In the three-mile race Moore was leading the field when he fell just before the final lap.

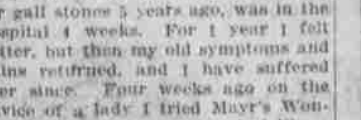
