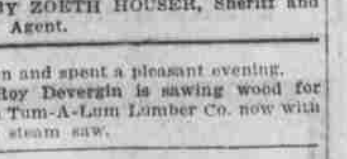
ADAMS CORRESPONDENT DESCRIBES GARAGE FIRE
