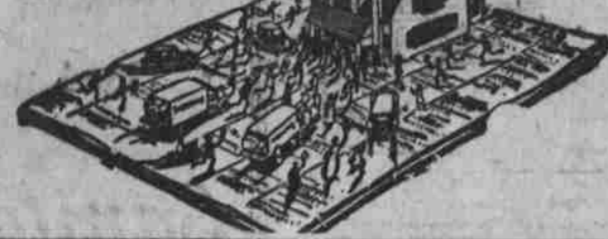

**FRENCH RAILWAY PARIS PACT**
