BOSTON, Feb. 12.—(A. P.)—The Commercial Bulletin today said: "There has been a fair business reported during the week, although the demand has not been spirited in the American market. Prices are steady. America has been buying freely in Australia and in Liverpool this week of the best Australian wools at firm rates and in South America also where prices are slightly dearer.  
"The goods market is still developing very slowly, manufacturers delaying openings for a more favorable opportunity. The senate is making progress on the tariff bill, but conservative observers do not believe that the bill will be enacted finally."
