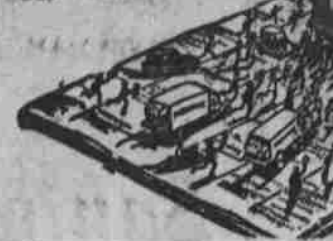
Attempts are being made to arrange a game with the Portland coast league club.
